MINISTER'S LETTER

REFLECTING ON THE HOLY SPIRIT

It's not long till Pentecost Sunday, and I find myself reflecting on the incredible power and presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

Pentecost is such a special time for us as Christians, one of the three great feasts in the Christian calendar. It's a time to remember and celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the early disciples, as describe in the book of Acts. The Holy Spirit came like a fire, rushing wind and tongues of empowering the disciples to boldly proclaim the Gospel in languages they didn't even know. May we be a people who are continually filled with the Holy Spirit, shining the light of Christ wherever we go.

As we celebrate Pentecost this year, let's remember the incredible gift we've been given in the Holy Spirit. Let's lean into her presence and power, knowing that with her, all things are possible.

A SMALL FLOOD, A LEAK AND A LACK OF LIGHT



Church buildings and resources are both a blessing and a challenge. They serve us well but, from time to time, require attention. Recently, when showing some visitors the church yard, Sue was surprised to discover water gushing through one of the cistern overflows onto the path outside. On further investigation she found that the toilet area, off the hall and the adjacent store room were flooded. Not as dramatic as the one experienced by Noah but a problem none-the-less.

The float valve in one of the toilet cisterns have broken off and so it was overflowing. Sue was able, with help

from our neighbours, to wedge the valve closed and stop the flow.

The following morning, assisted by Revd Adam and his wife Gillian, and a loan of the carpet cleaner (water vacuum) from Leiston United Church, the water was cleared and the valve replaced.

Our kitchen water heater (under the sink), which provide hot water for washing up etc. has also sprung a



leak but thankfully not causing a flood. We are very grateful to local plumber, Chris Buzzard, who not only confirmed the problem but replaced the heater in a very short time frame.

Our TV screen that we use to display hymns and play music for our worship each week, as well as for our recently revived Film Afternoons, has failed. The problem was with the backlights who enable the image on the screen to be seen. Sadly, a repair is not possible and the warranty has expired so we will be having a new one shortly.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY



On Sunday 7th April, at Leiston United Church, as part of our Sunday worship we were thrilled to include the baptism of Freddie, son of Emily and Kierran. It was wonderful to see so many folk in church, including Freddie's family and friends, a fair number of whom were similarly new to the world.



The service was led by our minister Revd Adam and was, in fact, the first baptism he had conducted since his ordination in 2022 and was the first baptism in the church for seventeen years. As part of the message Adam spoke of the meaning of Freddie's names. Freddie means "Peaceful Ruler" and Michael means "Who is like God?" or "Gift of God" all very appropriate. Family friends read the two passages from the Bible and the hymns included two chosen by Emily and Kierran, "All things bright and beautiful" and "Lord of all hopefulness."

We continue to pray for Freddie, Emily and Kierran and support them in any way we can.

PROJECT 40SEVEN AGREEMENT AND PROGRESS



We have, for some time, been working to secure agreement with the URC Eastern Province Trust, who own the church building and the land associated with it, to secure agreement for Project 40Seven to "officially" have access across Church Square and the passage way. The assurance of this agreement will enable them to advance some of the aspects of their plans.

After a considerable time, during which the agreement was being examined and approved by the trust legal advisors, we are pleased to report that the signed copies of the agreement are now complete. We very much hope that Project 40Seven will now be able to proceed with some of the exciting and ambitious aspects of the development of the building.

We continue to value the developing partnership with the project, especially the mutual support between the Food Bank and the Community Larder.
